DIRECTIONS TO REUNION

To get to Harley Park and Shelter House #3: coming from the west on I-70, exit at the Hwy 5 exit and follow to Sombart Rd. You can follow the signs to the Isle of Capri Casino, but you won't go as far as the Isle.

Rolling Hills Park is on the right side of the road and you turn left onto Sombart. Sombart runs into Santa Fe Trail, go right; it will be several blocks and the entrance to the park is on the left; follow the main road through the park and just at the end of the ball fields, on the left is a restroom and next to that, Shelter House #3. We will have the Cole Family Reunion banner hanging on the posts.

If you are in town, go to Morgan Street Park, the intersection of Morgan and Main, where Hannah's statue is. Follow Morgan Street on out to the park. Number 3 is the first one on the right as you enter the park.

Bring your lawn chairs or blankets, but there are a lot of tables there. Restrooms right next door; big playground very close for the kids; lots of parking just across the street. And ball diamonds.

The historic Indian Mounds are right around the corner and the beautiful Missouri River overlook. You can hike a trail down to the railroad tracks and the river, if you are in good shape and have the right shoes. (I'll just go to the overlook.) And at this point, if the river is still this high, you won't have so far to hike to get to it.
